What's involved?

- Offer emotional support to people affected by PSP & CBD
- Explain the range of support and services that PSPA can offer
- Enable people to identify problems as they arise and explore how these might be managed, outlining the sort of options available and how to access them
- Keep accurate and relevant records in accordance with PSPA's guidelines
- Attend regular training and development events
- You will need to be able to work as a team and have the ability to develop and maintain supportive relationships.

- Effective communicator
- Reliable
- Understanding of dealing with sensitive and confidential information
- Excellent listening skills

• Be computer literate, have basic admin skills and be able to travel within your local area.
